SPRINGDALE TOWN BOARD

TUESDAY, APRIL 15, 2025

TB APPROVED 5/20/25

1. **Call to order and certification of compliance with open meetings law** by Rosenbaum at 7:51 PM. A quorum of TB members present including Rosenbaum, Altschul and Schwenn. Also present were Patrolman Dahlk, Treasurer Shatrawka, and Admin/Clerk Arthur. Arthur confirmed posting in accordance with the open meeting law on 4/9 springdalewi.gov and 4/14 at Town Hall. Mt. Horeb Mail notified 4/9.
2. **Approval of the agenda** by unanimous consent.
3. **Bid opening – Town road bids for 2025 road work and LRIP project.** All bids were sealed and opened during the meeting.
LRIP, Messerschmidt Dr., full width overlay.
 - Scotts – \$76.25/ton, \$84,047.
 - Payne & Dolan – \$70/ton. Total \$77,140. LOW BID.
 - TriCounty Paving – \$75.20/ton. \$82,870. Additional milling butt joints. Total \$88,670.**MOTION** (Schwenn/Altschul) to choose low bid Payne + Dolan for LRIP Messerschmidt project. 3 ayes, 0 nays.

Chipseal – single seal Lunde Ln., double seal Grimstad

1. Fahrner – Lunde, \$20,871; Grimstad, \$8,860; total \$29,641
 2. Scotts – Lunde, \$16,000; Grimstad, \$10,600; total \$26,600.
- MOTION**
- (Schwenn/Altschul) to hire Scotts to double seal Grimstad and single seal Lunde for \$26,600. 3 ayes, 0 nays.

Town Hall ditching/culvert

1. Finks - \$10,500
 2. Jones Excavating - \$10,400, plus \$1,800 for culvert, \$12,200
 3. STT Enterprises - \$23,000

- (Altschul/Schwenn) to accept Finks' bid for ditching and culvert installation on Town Hall Rd. 3 ayes, 0 nays.

Crack Filling (Town Hall road to Ridgeview). Bid up to \$25,000, no start and stop.

1. Fahrner – not to exceed \$25,000. Haven't used Fahrner before.
 2. Crack Filling Service Corp. didn't break it down by road like Fahrner did. Have had them do it in the past, would like to stick with them.
 3. Thunder Rd., Waukesha. Project total TBD based on options listed.

- (Schwenn/Rosenbaum) to hire Crack Filling Service out of Cross Plains for Town Hall and Ridgeview Roads. 3 ayes, 0 nays.

Klevenville-Riley Rd.

1. Finks - \$18,900
- MOTION**
- (Altschul/Rosenbaum)to accept Finks' bid for \$18,900 to repair Klevenville Riley Rd.
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- Discussion: \$163,870 so far with all bids. Hot and cold mix, budgeted \$215,000.
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- 3 ayes, 0 nays, motion carried.

4. **Bid opening – Town garage ventilation project.**

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- Southport Engineered Systems, Caledonia – base bid \$44,490; \$38,590 alternate 1 (alternate makeup air unit same performance); and \$37,990, alternate 2 (design build option)
- Harker, \$57,260
- Helm Service, Muskego \$69,846
- Hooper, Deforest \$64,550, + \$8,500 for electrical
- 1901 Inc. \$63,500

Rosenbaum initiated tabling until we do further design inquiries. Revisit again in May. Will also go look at fire dept. in Mount Horeb.

5. Minutes of previous Town Board meetings

- 3/18 monthly board meeting **MOTION** (Schwenn/Altschul) to approve March minutes as drafted. 3 ayes, 0 nays.

6. Public comment. No comments.

7. Treasurer's report: discussion of revenues, expenses, and payment of the bills. March had little in revenue. Paid debt service for Mt. Horeb Fire Department. Not a lot of activity.

MOTION (Schwenn/Altschul) to pay the bills. No further discussion. 3 ayes, 0 nays.

8. Patrolman's report. Sign update – making progress putting signs onto posts. More signs received from Decker because they weren't on-hand. Waiting for Digger's Hotline to mark. Signed contract for next year's salt already, booked another 300 tons.

9. Riley Tavern special permit for outdoor consumption and special permits for amplified sound within the outdoor consumption area (as per Springdale Code 7-2-17). Anticipated events:

- 6/7 – NNSB/Stop & Listen, 1-4PM
- 6/28 – Dawg Bones, 1-4PM
- 7/26 – Red Hot Corn Dogs, 1-4PM

As per Springdale ordinance, Arthur confirmed that neighbor notices were mailed 4/11/25 to 4 abutters. No neighbors present.

MOTION (Rosenbaum/Altschul) to approve the 3 outdoor music events at the Riley Tavern. 3 ayes, 0 nays.

10. Farley Center annual report to the Board, Shedd Farley. Shedd present. Sales of 157 burials, 29 cremation burials. 2023 full body was 342. 59 full body burials for 2024, 13 cremation burials.

11. Discussion of traffic on Spring Rose Road due to Co. G detour – Rosenbaum. Lots of complaints due to County Rd. G detour with traffic on Spring Rose Rd. Town of Verona going to rent speed activated signs and Sheriff's office. State trooper agreed to sit there.

12. Update on Town recodification project, schedule meeting with A. Harvey – Arthur. Pick a Monday that works for Alan.

13. 4/1 election results and recap – Arthur. 288 absentees issued, 261 returned. 1620 registered voters. 1249 votes cast for a 77% turnout. Results:
